STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Act 37 of 1975.- The Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946, provides that employers in industrial establishments should define with sufficient precision the conditions of employment under them and to make the said conditions known to the workmen employed by them. The Act applies to every industrial establishment wherein 100 or more workmen are employed or were employed on any day of the preceding 12 months.

There are a large number of industrial establishments which employ 50 or more workers but less than 100 where it is felt necessary that the conditions of the employment should be specifically laid down so that the incidence of the industrial disputes and unrest be minimised.

Hence this Bill.

THE INDUSTRIAL EMPLOYMENT (STANDING ORDERS) (KARNATAKA AMENDMENT) ACT, 1975

(Received the assent of the President on the Sixth day of September 1975)

An Act to amend the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946 in its application to the State of Karnataka.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946 (Central Act 20 of 1946) in its application to the State of Karnataka;

BE it enacted by the Karnataka State Legislature in the Twenty-sixth year of the Republic of India as follows :-

1. Short title and commencement.- (1) This Act may be called the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) (Karnataka Amendment) Act, 1975.

(2) It shall come into force on such ¹[date] as the State Government, may by notification in the official Gazette, appoint.

2. Amendment of section 1.- In section 1 of the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946 (Central Act 20 of 1946) in its application to the State of Karnataka, for the words "one hundred" occurring in sub-section (3) and in the proviso to it, the word "fifty", shall be substituted.
